Classroom Expectations

Every year as we return to school and begin working in new classes and teams, the staff and students have lots of discussions about how we agree to work with each other to make sure everyone feels safe and has the right to learn and teach without disruption.

In the coming weeks at the assembly, students will be presenting their manifestos, created as part of these discussions.

So, if students and staff have agreements, it seems right that our school community should also understand how to ensure that our school is a safe and inclusive one.

What are some of the behaviours that are encouraged?

All members of school communities are expected to:

- conduct themselves in a lawful, ethical, safe and responsible manner that recognises and respects the rights of others.

Students are expected to:

- participate actively in the school's education program
- take responsibility for their behaviour and learning
- demonstrate respect for themselves, other members of the school community and the school environment
- behave in a manner that respects the rights of others, including the right to learn
- cooperate with staff and others in authority.

Parents/carers are expected to:

- show an active interest in their child's schooling and progress
- cooperate with the school to achieve the best outcomes for their child
- support school staff in maintaining a safe and respectful learning

- initiate and sustain constructive communication and relationships with school staff regarding their child's learning, wellbeing and behaviour
- contribute positively to behaviour support plans that concern their child.

Schools are expected to:

- provide safe and supportive learning environments
- provide an inclusive and engaging curriculum and teaching
- initiate and maintain constructive communication and relationships with students and parents/carers
- promote the skills of responsible self-management

For parents and carers, how would this look?

These are a few examples:

- Attend parent meetings and other school events wherever possible
- Read notices, newsletters and regularly check the website for up to date information
- Provide a quiet place at home for homework, and establish a routine for completing tasks at home
- Speak to your child's teacher about any concerns you might have – do this early rather than letting things mount up
- Understand that children often do childish things – it is in their nature, but when they endanger the safety or right to learn of themselves or others, consequences will apply.

We frame agreements in positive language, outlining what should be done rather than what you shouldn't do. However, some behaviours are not acceptable. Here are two examples:

- You should never approach a student who is not your child to address behavioural issues. Leave this to the teaching staff. Think about it this way: would you like a parent approaching your child in the playground without your knowledge?
- You should never tell your child to retaliate if they have been hurt in the playground. Speak to a staff



THE ZONES OF REGULATION®

Zones of Regulation is a way of teaching self-regulation and self-control. Students learn a common vocabulary of emotional terms. They also learn the importance of reading facial expressions and body language, along with calming and alerting strategies. Today our year 1/2 students enjoyed a range fun filled activities that encouraged problem solving, exploration of sensory tools and learning to read facial expressions.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE - INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum. CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per Student is \$125 for primary school students.

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018 you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.
